Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

In a science experiment a group of students were given mugs with their school logo on. A second group were not given mugs. Then the students without mugs were asked how much they would pay to have a mug. Likewise, the group with mugs were asked how much they would need to be paid to part with it.

The results were interesting. It turns out that the amount you are prepared to pay to get a mug with your school logo on it is about half as much as the student selling it believes they would need to part with it. Human beings value the things they have twice as much as things they might have in future. It seems that we are not very good at imagining how it will feel to have things in future. But are brilliant at understanding how loss feels right now!

This is the first time that I won't be able to see my mum at Christmas. Now I know that Christmas is just a day, that there are vaccines on the way. Very soon we will be able to meet and even hug safely. But the truth is, right now, I feel sad. A classic case of overvaluing my present loss against a future when we can meet safely.

Which brings us rather nicely to advent when we as the church celebrate and remember the gift of God's Son. And God's promise that one day this same Son will return in glory to rule and reign over all the earth. A day "the glory of the lord shall be revealed, and all the people shall see it together." When God will reward and recompense his flock carrying them tenderly in his bosom.

This promise is very beautiful... and very hard to imagine.

Because it's hard to imagine, it's easy to undervalue it. Just as students who didn't own mugs were not prepared to pay enough to buy one from those who did. They valued the money (the thing that they had and would have to sacrifice) more than the possibility of owning a mug.

As I prepare for Christmas I hope that God will use this time to reset my priorities. That he will give me a right way to value the gifts he has given me. And that he will teach me to value the promise of his return.

This Christmas is going to be very different. I will miss the Christingles. I will miss the look of terror on teachers' faces when Reverend Tina asks the tinies not to burn down her church. I will miss carols, and parties, and hugs. And I will miss my mum. But, maybe not having those things, for just one year, will make a little space. Space for God. Space for gratitude. And space to discover the true meaning of His promise of hope.

May you know God's promise of hope this Advent too.
